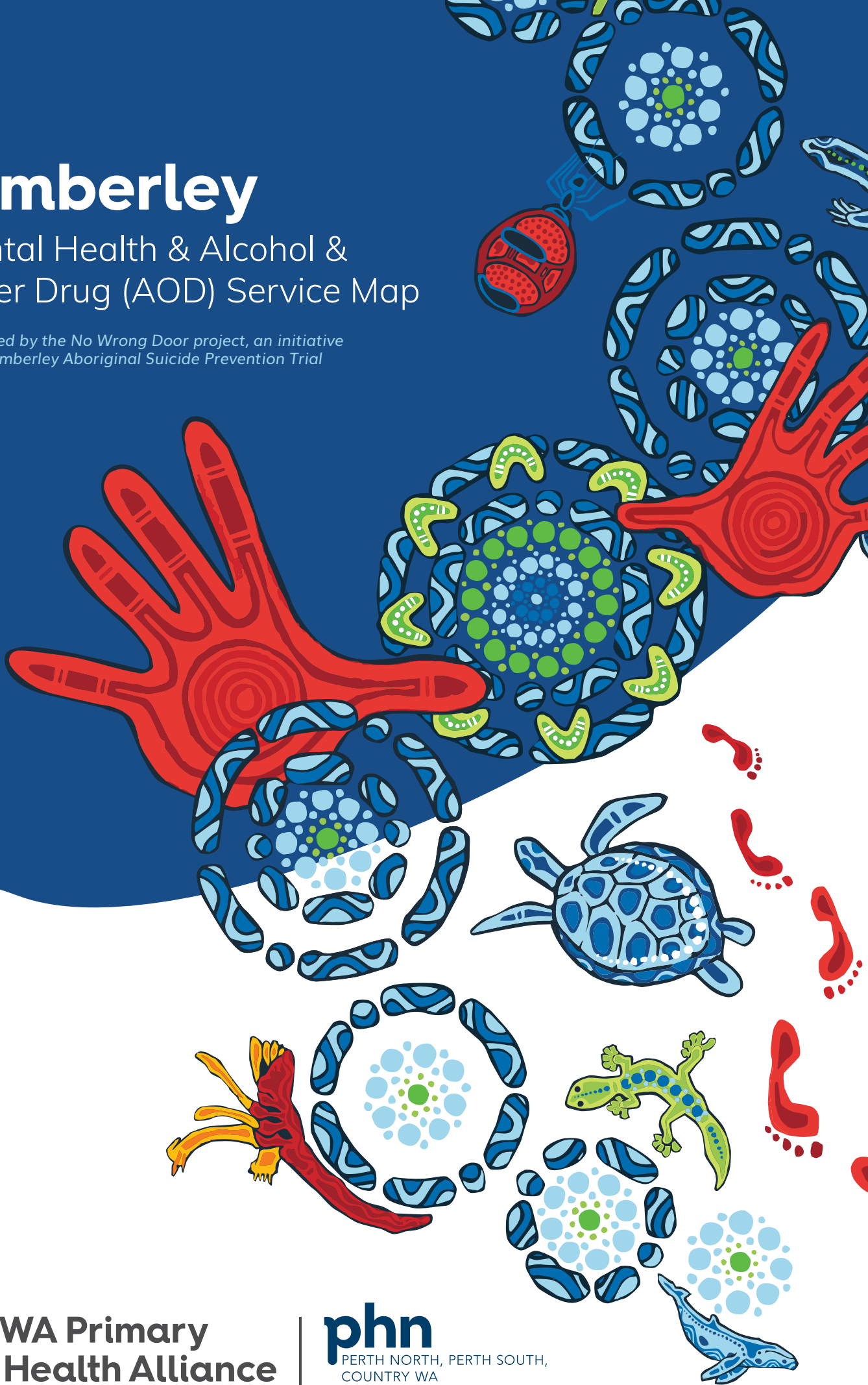

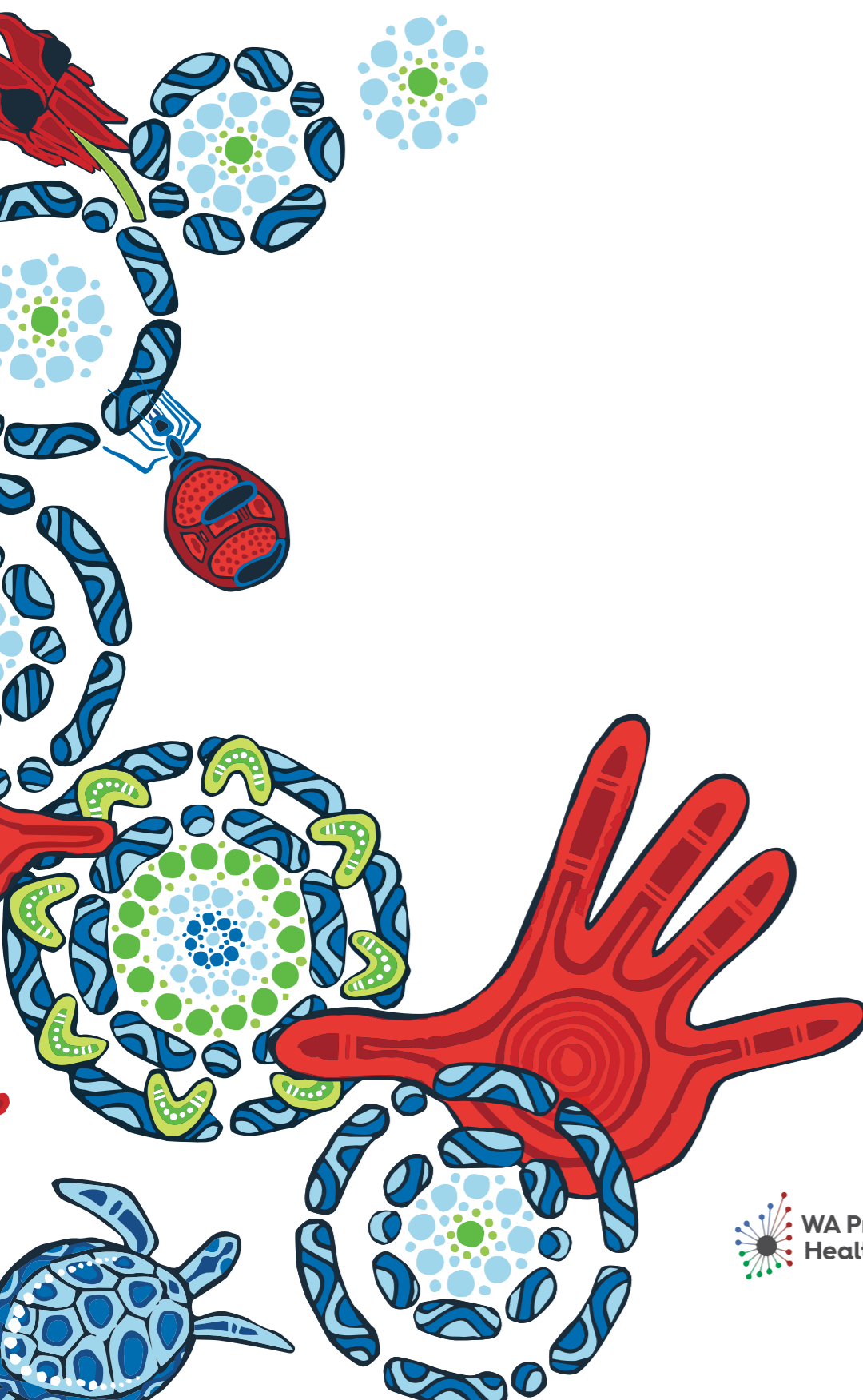

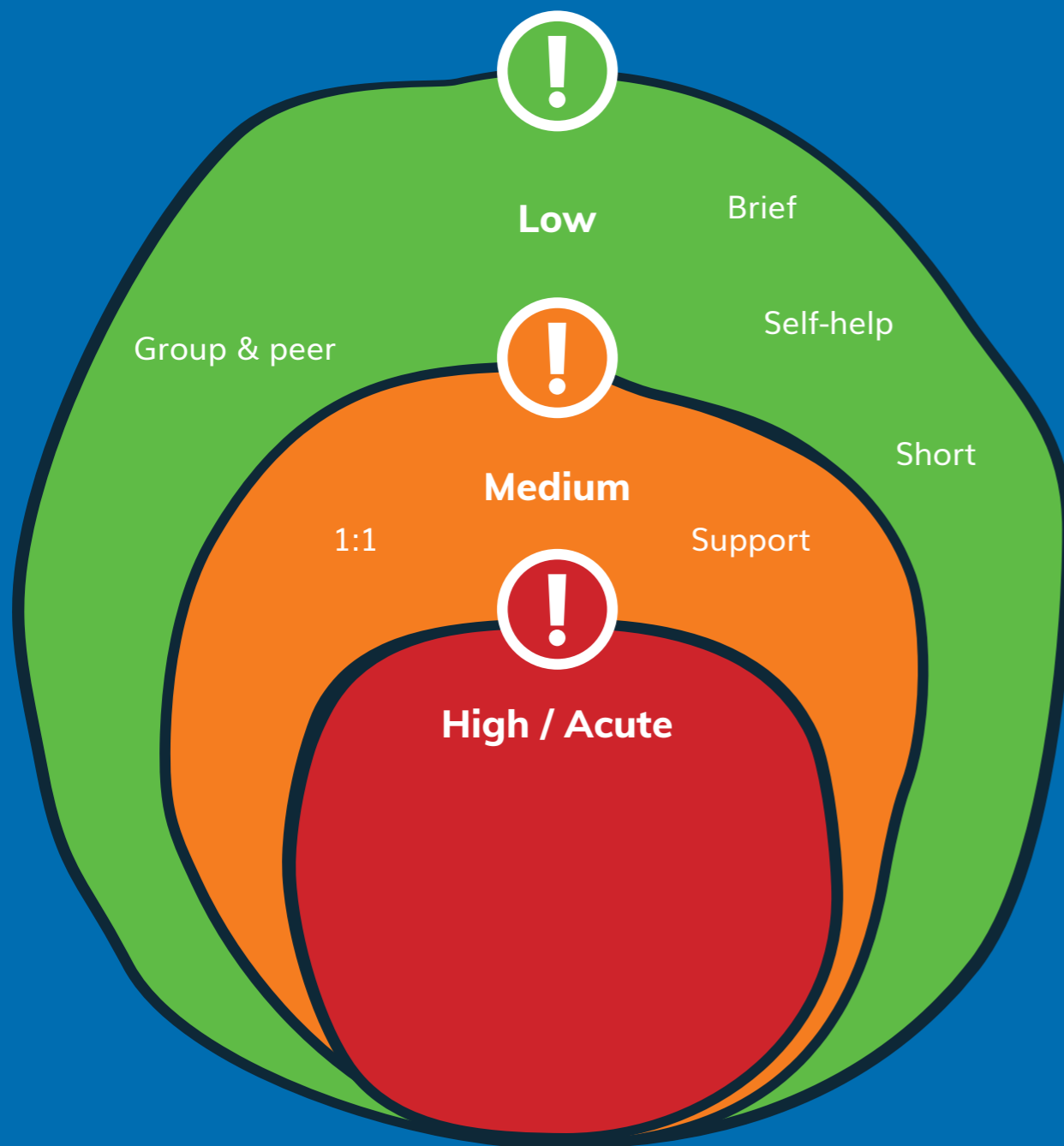
Introduction

The Kimberley Mental Health and Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) Service Map is a service directory of mental health and AOD services that are accessible to people residing in the Kimberley.

It is to assist Kimberley Service Providers with referring people to the right place, no matter where someone in crisis arrives.

This resource was developed by the No Wrong Door initiative as part of the Kimberley Aboriginal Suicide Prevention Trial and was supported through local partnerships with key agencies who are members of the Drug, Alcohol and Mental Health subcommittee of the Kimberley Aboriginal Health Planning Forum. It was developed thanks to organisations who provided their service details and may not include all available services in the region.

The Service Map has one section for each town (and surrounding communities) and one section with digital services. A symbol is displayed next to each listing as a quick guide to the level of support provided. The symbol resembles that below and conveys the following information:



Cultural Security Framework

The Cultural Security Framework for Kimberley Mental Health, Social and Emotional Wellbeing, and Alcohol and Other Drugs Services was developed by the Drug, Alcohol and Mental Health Subcommittee of the Kimberley Aboriginal Health Planning Forum (KAHPF) as an initiative of the Kimberley Aboriginal Suicide Prevention Trial.

The vision of the Framework is for the delivery of culturally secure mental health/social and emotional wellbeing and alcohol and other drug services and supports, which are responsive to, and respectful of, the cultural rights, values, beliefs and expectations of Aboriginal people in the Kimberley region.

The Framework takes a Continuous Quality Improvement approach, with four key result areas where cultural security should be addressed for both employees and community members. A supporting Guide and Self-Assessment Tool is available to assist services and organisations to self-manage implementation.

Organisations that have been assessed to comply with the Cultural Security Framework are indicated in the service map with the following symbol 🏠

Indigenous Corporations

An Indigenous corporation is an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander organisation registered under the Corporations (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) Act 2006, which means that it is a distinct legal entity.

An Australian Aboriginal flag symbol 🇺🇸 indicates that the service is provided by an Indigenous corporation.

No Wrong Door initiative

The Service Map was developed as an activity of the No Wrong Door initiative under the Kimberley Aboriginal Suicide Prevention Trial. The No Wrong Door initiative has the collective commitment:

"To work together to meet the needs of community, including young people, through cultural and clinical healing and coordinated partnership to prevent deliberate self-harm and suicidal behaviours in the Kimberley region."

No Wrong Door Principles

In 2019, a No Wrong Door workshop sought to explore a shared understanding of the purpose and definition of a No Wrong Door approach.

The No Wrong Door approach has four key elements:

- **Access:** People can get the help they need, when they need it, where they need it
- **Capacities:** The door doesn't matter, but the skills and knowledge of those behind it does
- **Connection:** The most important doors are family, community, and culture
- **Scale:** There are enough doors to connect services,

community, and culture.
